A Word from our Pastor

Greetings to all and welcome to the first OGC Newsletter of 2024. And what a start to the year it has been! We finally saw the launch of our brand spanking new Mississippi-West Tennessee Annual Conference of the Global Methodist Church, and boy O' boy did it live up to its billing! I don't know about everyone else, but I have been anticipating this day since even before I officially became your pastor. After watching several conferences across the U.S. hold their convening gatherings and hearing the excitement and joy of participants as the Holy Spirit showed up and enlivened every single event, I was more than ready to experience it for myself.

Experience it I did! And it was everything I had hoped for and more. Not only was the conference doused in spirituality. Not only was it filled with a palpable presence of the Holy Spirit (enough to make your hair stand on end). But highest leaders of the church were talking about (and getting excited about!) such things as scriptural holiness, class meetings, biblical authority, and more. WoW! Those are the very things that drew me into ministry in the first place, and witnessing them become the siren calls of the leadership of our denomination had me literally dancing with joy in the aisles. I had been waiting so long for those things to happen that the whole "Abstinence makes the heart grow fonder" thing became reality for my new life as a Global Methodist pastor.

I'm sure some of you when you hear me going on about "Scriptural Holiness" and such, probably either wonder what that's all about or shrink from it thinking it's something beyond your reach. That's not the case at all and you don't need to be afraid to think of yourself as being holy. Holiness is really nothing more than heeding the Bible's call to "be holy, for I [the Lord] am holy." (1 Peter 1:16) Which by the way, doesn't mean you have to be a Saint of the Church, or a pope, or a priest, or a pastor, or anything else. All it means to be "holy" is to be set apart for God's exclusive use. So, for instance, if you have a holy altar, that altar belongs to God and can only be used by God. When Paul calls the folks at Corinth "Saints" or "Holy" people, all he is saying is that they have been given a new identity because of what Christ did for them on the cross and they now belong to God and can only be used by Him.

When you think about it that way, doesn't it just make sense that when you surrender to Christ, you are surrendering everything to God, and therefore, should rightfully only be available for use as one of God's own? That's holiness, and considering the alternative, I think it's not only an accessible place to want to be, but a desirable standard to strive for in one's life. "I want to be holy" is not a sentence I would have always been comfortable saying out loud. Now I relish it as an all-in servant of Jesus Christ, and as such am motivated to share that "scriptural holiness" with everyone and in every place I possibly can. One of the main reasons I love Methodism is because it unabashedly claims that banner as its standard-bearer of the faith.

All that said, if you think that a banner of holiness might be a whole lot easier to claim than it is to actually live into, don't worry, you're not alone. Then again, if it was easy, everyone would be doing it and doing it right. We'll be talking over the next months (and maybe even years) about life applications of holiness and how to live into the call to be holy as God is holy, and it is my hope you will relax your barriers and just enjoy the ride. Some of what we'll be talking about might seem a little (or a lot) foreign at first, but trust me, after a while, it not only gets easier, but a lot of what we'll be exploring will become second nature and things you don't want to live without.

I hope your February is filled with the love of Christ, a solid hope for the future, and a joyful holiness that draws you nearer to the life God wants for all His children.

ALTAR'D






