A Word from our Pastor

Wow! Can you believe it's already June?! Not so hard to I guess, given the fact that late-May temps have already graced us with scorching mid-nineties that felt at times like were exceeding 101 degrees. I suppose the temps match the season of Holy Fire (i.e. Pentecost) With the celebrations of Pentecost and Trinity Sunday in our rearview mirrors we head into what our Church calendar calls "Regular Time." I used to find that designation such an odd thing, especially since it's the longest season on the Church calendar, and wondered what it meant to be in regular time vs... what? Not-regular time?

I think the main reason I didn't originally understand it was because I had unintentionally dissociated "Regular Time" from the other name this season goes by, "The Season After Pentecost." I didn't mean to do that, but until I entered the ministry and started studying things of the Church, I didn't know what I hadn't been taught. That's one of

the things that fires my soul as a pastor; the fact that so much of what the Church represents has been lost to so much of the Body of Christ. And while most of it is not necessary to salvation, there is a lot about the Church that serves to enrich the lives of Christians and keep alive, not just the memory of Christ and all He taught, but the essentials of what it means to be a child of God.

The season of Pentecost is the perfect example of what rediscovering an important teaching that's been handed down by the Church Universal, but largely lost to the contemporary Church, has meant for me. When I finally put this season called "Regular Time" together in my head with its other designation as "The Season After Pentecost," I began to understand that what it represented was the fact that it is indeed "regular" or standard or expected for the Holy Spirit to be a part of the "regular" life of the Church. In fact, that is key



to recapturing the richness and beauty of what the Church means for our regular, everyday lives as Christians who are set apart as holy unto the Lord. When we get that, it enables us to be more in-touch with the Holy Spirit residing not just in us, but in all of God's creation, which in turn it helps us have the reverence for the kingdom of God for which we were created.

As we move through the second half of our sermon series on *The Class Meeting*, my hope is that you will all catch a little of the fire for getting back to our roots as Methodists, which is to say getting back to the roots of our lives as Christians. We all know (because we've seen it happen before our very eyes) how easy it is to stray from biblical standards and 2000 years of Church tradition. It's time to fix all that and be the blessings to all the peoples of the earth we were meant to be.
