. A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

"For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sake he became poor, so that you through his poverty might become rich." 2 Corinthians 8:9

Most of what follows are not my words, but they are my heart, and I thought worth sharing with you as my newsletter article for the month:

"When Jesus ascended the mountain to teach the crowds, those watching Him expected Him to proclaim a powerful new authority over the currently ruling party. The Romans, who had occupied the Jewish territories, had instituted a brutal regime that saw widespread poverty and violence against the people. In Jesus, the people saw a King who was coming to rid the land of the Romans and bring health and wealth to the people once more. No longer would they be slaves of the Roman empire, they would now live comfortable with King Jesus! Imagine their confusion when Jesus uttered these world-changing words: "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the Kingdom of Heaven." Matthew 5:3

When Jesus arrived, He brought in His wake an entirely new ethic for living in the Kingdom of God. No longer were men and women to vie for position and power, but instead, they were to become one another's servants. Instead of storing up wealth in their storehouses, they were to fling open the doors with joy and give to all who had need. Rather than seek justice for wrongdoing, these new people were to live with open-handed generosity and forgiveness to all. Can you see now why the people started to walk away from Jesus when they heard these words?

In His life, Jesus showed that the way we live our lives physically shows how we are spiritually. Jesus Himself modeled this ethic when He humbled Himself and left His throne as King of Kings to become a poor, destitute infant in a barn. His life of poverty and His death on the brutal Roman cross showed that His work was not of a physical Kingdom, but

of a spiritual one.

It is this amazing grace Jesus showed that the apostle Paul writes of in 2 Corinthians. When we truly grasp how Jesus lived His life, we begin to understand how we are to live as His disciples. Though Jesus had great power and wealth as a King, He bowed down to become a suffering servant. Though we have wealth and power in the resurrected life, we are to bow as well to serve those who are unlike us — even those who stand against us! In this humility the believer isn't powerless — rather they are at their most powerful and purposeful in their serving."*

Questions to reflect on this month:

- 1. What does this life of powerful humility look like for you?
- 2. How would you have to change in order to live your life like that every day?
- 3. Reread 2 Corinthians 8:9 and think about how Jesus's life on earth shows us how we are to live as His disciples, then as yourself: When people look at me, do they see Jesus in my actions and words?

Our country is at an inflection point and we as individuals have little to say about the direction it will choose. What we do have power over is how we will choose to live into the outcome, regardless of the choice the people ultimately make. We also have the power of the Kingdom at our side, and our prayers and life choices make a difference. How will you choose to live?

We also had the Gideons come and give out Bibles to our older class of 4th - 6th graders. In addition, we gave 2 Bibles to 2 children who said they did not have a Bible at home and wanted one. What a blessing that was!



Second, Camp Wesley Pines starts Monday, July 1st. Please have your kids here no later than 7:30 a.m. so we can load the church bus and head out. We are taking 13 children this year! Please be in prayer for these kids as they go to camp and experience a wonderful week of growing closer to God.



Next, we will begin a little fundraiser during the month of July to raise money for our playground renovation. The Wall of Money Challenge will begin June 30 and run through the month of July or until all the envelopes have been taken. It is very simple.

There will be 100 envelopes. Simply pick an envelope with a number on it and put that amount in the envelope. If you get envelope #4, put \$4.00 in it, if you get envelope #57, put

\$57.00 in the envelope, etc. If all 100 envelopes are taken and returned, then we will raise \$5,150.00. Of course, if you want to round up then we can raise even more! There will be a box to deposit them in or you can hand

them in at the office. If you want tax credit, please write your name on the envelope before you turn it in.

Finally, it is time to start planning for the fall. Please let me know if you want to join or return to our children's ministry by teaching Sunday School or leading a Wednesday night group. We can always use more help and we would



love to have you assist! We are also working on adding a new ministry to our children's program so stay tuned for more information on that!
