

### . . . . . . . . A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR . . . . . . . . .

<sup>13</sup> For you were called to freedom, brothers and sisters; only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but through love become slaves to one another. <sup>14</sup> For the whole law is summed up in a single commandment, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' <sup>15</sup> If, however, you bite and devour one another, take care that you are not consumed by one another. (Galatians 5:13-15)

Can I tell you, it feels like Paul's admonitions to the Galatians were prophetic utterances meant for the Church today. Verse 15 is of particular conviction for me; "If you bite and devour one another." I too often feel like I am biting and devouring way more than I should and have had to do a lot of repenting as a result.

I have always prided myself on the fact that I could go into "enemy territory", have dialogue with people who have different values than I do, and leave not only having grown from the conversation, but confident that the people I had been in conversation with wondering where I stood on things. That's not to say I didn't hold to my convictions, but rather that I was able to have dialogue without feeling a need to get all up in people's faces to make my point. Of course, it never hurt when those folks wanted to have an exchange of ideas as well.

Either the world has changed, or I have become less diplomatic than I used to be. I suppose it could be a mixture of the two. Nevertheless, whichever is the case, I have found it increasingly difficult to have an intelligent exchange of ideas with people whose ideologies are different from mine. And while I can admit to being part of the problem, I have to say that the vitriol being thrown around these days is way more aggressive than it was say, five or ten years ago. For my part, I find I am "biting" and getting drawn into the mud more often than I should (which is to say I never should) and being put in time out by the Holy Spirit.

The sad part is I know better. I have no illusions that I am going to change people's minds about ideologies and misguided beliefs they have become rabidly obsessed with clinging to, but I allow the goading to draw me in and before I know it, I've said something I regret. At that point all I can hear is James redressing me with his admonition that "If anyone thinks he is religious and does not bridle his tongue but deceives his heart, this person's religion is worthless." (James 18:21) That became an even louder rebuke as I prepared for my sermon this week, which of course is (by now was) titled, How to Have Religion that isn't Worthless.

A little later in his letter to the church at Galatia, Paul implores believers to "...not grow weary of doing good, for in due season we will reap, if we do not give up." (6:9) And that's the mic drop we all need to pay attention to in these troubled times. Faith tells us we win. God's reign, even when it is challenged by repeated occurrences of paganized societies (Rome, Ottoman, Soviet Union, European Union...now America), and the number of true followers of Jesus contract, the Church never goes away. Over the past 2000 years the one institution still standing is the one that represents the true sovereignty of God on earth made flesh in the person of Christ Jesus our Lord.

The Scriptures tell us that "If we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience," (8:25) and that comes just before my favorite verse in the Bible, "[For] we know that all things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose." (8:28) Let's all try to be more patient, letting our faith inform our attitudes, trusting that everything is going to work out for the good in the end, and loving our neighbor as ourselves. If we do that, we'll have a whole lot less heartburn and a whole lot more peace of mind.




