

# ..... A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR .....

Man!! What a time we have been through as a nation. I don't know about y'all, but I feel beaten up and worn down by all the negativity of a long and divisive election season. It brings to mind a proverb that goes something like this: "Many are the plans in a person's heart, but it is the Lord's purpose that prevails." (Proverbs 19:21) That kind of goes to the heart of our struggles as God's people. We "think" we're in control. We "think" that so and so got elected because we participated in the election and made our voices heard. I suppose that's true to a certain extent, but in my book, we'll have more of an impact on the world if we do as the Chronicler wrote that God told us to do: "If my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and will heal their land." (2 Chronicles 7:14)

In any case, I am taking a little personal time to go "Phew!" and breathe in a sigh of relief now that things are beginning to cool down a bit (I know, I know. That's not true across the board, but one can hope...). I knew way before the election was over that no matter who won we would collectively be in sore need of a distraction to help refocus our spirits on Jesus. And what better way to do that than by delving into the wonder of the Christmas season to try and recapture a little of the innocence of the Nativity of the Christ. It has felt in recent times as if we are losing the ability to experience the kind of awe embodied by the miraculous birth of Jesus.

Stop for a minute and think about some of the themes surrounding the birth narrative. The Messiah was born. Say that out loud. "The Messiah was born." If simply saying those words doesn't cause you to have chills, then you aren't really appreciating what they actually mean for humanity as a whole. "The" Savior. The one and only Messiah of God was birthed to do what nothing else in all creation could do. That fact all by itself should leave one awestruck and filled with wonder, though I suspect some of us (most of us?) struggle to have much more than a passing respect for what it really means. Don't sweat it. You're not alone.

Then there's the whole Mary and Joseph thing. Some of you are too young to remember the shame an unwed pregnancy meant as little as 50 or 60 years ago. Society hasn't always been as tolerant of such things as it is these days (not sure if that's a good thing or a bad thing), and even those days were nothing compared to what the young earthly parents of Jesus faced as a result of the virgin pregnancy. I mean, what a story, right? A virgin conceiving a child and naming Him "God with us". (Isaiah 7:13) Who, besides a long dead prophet would believe such a thing? What we pass off as marking just another year of celebration and revelry, is nothing short of an awe-inspiring miracle of epic proportions, and too often we fail to appreciate the wonder of it all.

What say we buck the trends this year? How about we strive to rediscover for ourselves the wonder we push on our kids year in and year out? What if every time we encountered the story of Jesus's birth between Thanksgiving and Christmas, we saw it with new eyes and a renewed innocence for a narrative we've stopped truly hearing amid the busyness of adult life? I am praying with the Apostle Paul, that God, the source of hope, will fill us all completely with joy and peace because we trust in him. May the Christmas season overflow with confident hope through the power of the Holy Spirit. (from Romans 15:3) Indeed, may all of us recapture the awe of the Messiah's birth in the weeks to come and beyond. I don't know about anyone else, but I need that. My heart needs that. And I suspect at least some of y'all's hearts need that too.

Thank you for your faithful giving in 2024. As the end of the year approaches, below are a few reminders regarding year-end giving:

All contributions to Oak Grove Church are tax deductible. Contribution statements for 2024 will be distributed on or before January 31, 2025. Please check your final year-end statements before filing your 2024 taxes.

- Contributions received by **mail** <u>must be postmarked</u> by the U.S. Postal Service on or before December 31 to be applied to your 2024 contribution statement.
- For contributions made **online**, please note that our merchant provider requires a processing window for all online contributions 3 business days for credit/debit card transactions. Because of the processing window, please be aware that your contribution will be posted on the settlement date (when deposit is made to church checking account,) not the date you scheduled the contribution. As with all banking transactions, online transactions are only processed on business days defined as a calendar day other than Saturday, Sunday, or a federal holiday.
- The Church Office will be closed for Christmas Tuesday, December 24— Thursday, December 26.
- The Church Office will be open on Monday, December 30 from 8 am until 2 pm to receive contributions.
- The Church Office will be closed on Tuesday, December 31—January 1, 2025.
- All contributions received on or after January 1, 2025 will be posted to 2025 even if the check is dated 2024.
