...A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR...

So this is it! We have finally come to the time Garrett has relentlessly promised for the past three months. It seems like it's been longer, doesn't it? That he has been promising more to come with regards to *The Grove* forever and a day? Well, as Garrett himself noted, he may be many things, but a liar he is not. We are officially kicking off our class meeting style small group ministry, and we're doing so with no less than five small group offerings out of the gate.

For those of you new to the church, we went through an 8 week sermon series back in the summer on the history, current state of, and efficacy of small group formation in the Methodist tradition. I followed the basic structure as laid out in a book by Keven Watson called *The Class Meeting* (copies are available upon request). A group of us then began meeting in September following the sermon series to experience what these groups are like first hand and to be a seed group for training small group leaders in preparation for this launch.

The time is here and everyone is invited. But to what, some of you may ask. For those who may have forgotten what these small groups are all about, in essence, they are safe havens where everyone has a place to belong and share their experiences of our Holy God in daily life without judgement or unsolicited advice or any worries that what they share will go beyond their group. The Grove Small Groups are not Bible studies, though Scripture and biblical topics and discussions are certainly welcome. They are also not gossip groups or complaint departments. They exist as places for getting to know ourselves and our brothers and sisters in Christ more deeply and intimately for the explicit purpose of growing our faith and discipling one another as we ourselves are discipled.

The Grove is also a place where you will never be lost in the crowd. No group will have more than 8 to 12 members. When they grow beyond those numbers it's time to split off and start a new group. Besides facilitating and leading gatherings, group leaders are charged with caring for their members by checking up on them whenever they are absent from a gathering or when life has become a challenge. In other words, our small groups and their leaders are there to "BE" the church and make sure no one slips through the cracks.

There is no requirement of membership or even attendance at our church in order to take part in The Grove. As Christians, we "encourage" participation in certain specific Christian practices we call "The Means of Grace," including but not necessarily limited to, church attendance (somewhere), prayer, reading and studying the Bible, Holy Communion, and more. But our main focus is to grow our relationships with Jesus Christ together.

YOU are invited to pray about joining one of these groups and becoming part of this new ministry sooner rather than later. Our ideal is for everyone who attends this church to be a member of one of *The Grove* small groups. At the very least we are hoping it becomes part of our core culture and a catalyst for inspiring spiritual first, and numeric growth to follow at OGC.

I know some of you are hesitant to give this ministry a try for various reasons, not the least of which are concerns about confidentiality. What I can offer is this: One of the most important rules of the small group is that what's shared there, stays there. Give it a try. You can be cautious about what you share as you build trust with the group, but you will never know what you're missing if you don't give them a chance. God is moving in our midst and it's time for us to embrace this proven method of Christian formation, if for no other reason than to help others by helping to make disciples for the transformation of the world.

She told the story of how she felt led to go on a mission trip to Honduras and that she was asked to do art



with the children. There were no art materials, bibles or even chairs for the children to sit on. They had nothing. She did not even speak their language, so she questioned how she could teach them about Jonah and the whale or Daniel in the lion's den. She did her best and the next year before going on the trip, she began to pray and to ask God how she could reach these children. The Holy Spirit led her to start from the beginning. So that is what she did. With her art she began to teach the children starting with the creation story.

Before the next trip, she began to think about how she could show these children what Jesus had done for them on the cross. She had taken some clay with her and added some mud to the clay. There were a few musicians there, so she told them to start playing and she would sit in the chair and try to create a visual for the children so they could "see" Jesus and what he had done for them. The bust of Jesus was the product of her work. THEY GOT IT!



All the things they had heard about Jesus finally made sense.

Kym urged each of us to use our gifts and talents to spread the gospel of Jesus wherever the Lord places us.
