

...A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR...

By the time this newsletter is published we will have just crossed the halfway point of our Lenten journey, continuing a slow but steady march towards Holy Week and the Easter celebration. I have only just become aware of an interesting confluence in teachings that was totally unplanned and unforeseen. In fact, the concurrence only happened because of unexpected delays in plans that were made months ago. What is this mysterious convergence? It's the coincidental emergence of the parable of the Prodigal Son in both our *Listen to Him* Lenten sermon series and OGC's confirmation class studies. What are the chances that one story in one chapter of the entire Bible would emerge in two completely separate studies, unplanned and at unawares of any of the planners? I don't even know how you would go about calculating those odds, but I'm thinking the chances are somewhere in the thousands or even millions to one.

Being a person who doesn't believe in coincidence when it comes to matters of spirituality, I'm going to go with this is a God thing and that God is speaking into our community in ways that haven't yet become apparent to me. Y'all know the story of course (and if not, you will by the time this week is over): Young foolish man, disrespects his dad by asking for his inheritance before dad dies, only to go off to an exotic place where he squanders everything. As a result, he ends up destitute and starving with nowhere to turn. Finally, he comes to his senses enough to return to his father's home, intending to beg for mercy and a place in his household as a lowly servant. But then to everyone who was listening to the parable's surprise, instead of rebuking and punishing his son, the father raced out to greet him and embrace him, kissing him as he clothed him in the finest of garments and declared a feast in honor of this son of his who "was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found!" (15:24)

There's so much hidden treasure in this story that we couldn't possibly cover it here in this newsletter article or my upcoming sermon combined. Even adding in our class time on Wednesdays we could only scratch the surface of meaning underlying this parable. But there's a little jewel most folks aren't aware of that would actually have been very noteworthy to first century denizens. And that's how the father raced out to meet his son. To run in that culture was to shame oneself. And yet, the father ran to greet his son. Why? Probably to get to the son before he arrived in the community where he would most certainly have been welcomed with humiliating taunts and rejection. In other words, dad wanted to show the community he forgave his son as an example to them of how they should be forgiving as well.

I generally teach the parable of the Prodigal Son from the perspective of either the son, the father, or the jealous brother who can't understand why his father was not just forgiving, but celebratory over his brother's return. As I'm writing this article, it's making me wonder if there isn't a message our church community in particular needs to hear. We are, after all, such a loving, kind, and giving congregation, especially towards fallen individuals whom we didn't know before they fell; as is apparent in our very generous food pantry and meals on wheels ministries. But what about people we do know who've gone by the wayside, or even wronged us personally? Are we as forgiving of them as the father of the prodigal son demonstrates for us?

I don't know who (if anyone) might need to hear this side of the Prodigal Son, but God laid it on my heart to put it out there, and since I don't believe in coincidence, I will be praying that whoever might need to hear it, hears it with the love and compassion it's meant to project. God's love and forgiveness came at a price, not the least of which was humbling His Son on the cross. How much humility and grace did that act of compassion and love purchase for you (from you)?

Let us pray: Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner. Grace and peace, Pastor Ted
