

# A Word from our Pastor

Have you ever wondered where the name Pentecost comes from? It's actually rooted in Judaism and a cognate of the Greek word for "five," penta, literally meaning "fiftieth." In the Old Testament, the Israelites celebrated the Festival of Weeks (or Shavuot) exactly fifty days after Passover, their most important religious festival of the year.

Shavuot itself is a spring harvest festival that while it never carried quite the same level of importance as Passover, it was (and is), nevertheless, a time of joyful celebration. In biblical times, work ceased, and people came to Jerusalem from all over carrying the first sheaves of the wheat harvest for an offering to celebrate God's provision of food.

Pentecost took a distinctly Christian turn early in the book of Acts when 120 followers of Jesus, including his mother Mary and some of his brothers, were all huddled in an upstairs room in Jerusalem, hiding out in fear of the local religious authorities. But they were also waiting. They were waiting for something that Jesus had promised before ascending to heaven...the outpouring of the Holy Spirit.

Suddenly, a sound like a violent wind filled the room where the disciples were hunkered down and tongues of fire descended to hover over their heads. Adding to the miraculous nature of the event, Jesus's followers began speaking in the languages of all the different peoples who had come to Jerusalem to celebrate the Festival of Weeks. It was such a strange event that some of the folks witnessing it thought Jesus's followers were drunk. But Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, rejected that explanation and proceeded to preach one of the most powerful and important sermons in the New Testament.

Peter pointed to the Old Testament prophet Joel's words (Joel 2:28-32) promising just such an outpouring of the Holy Spirit on all of God's people and how it fulfilled the promise Jesus had made to send an *Advocate* in His stead. This Jesus, whom you crucified, Peter informed the crowd, is the Messiah, God's promised Savior who has conquered sin and death. When they heard Peter's piercing words, the Bible tells us many were "cut to the heart," and asked, "What should we do?" Peter called on them to repent and believe in Jesus as their Lord and Savior. Many in the crowd did, and three thousand were baptized that day.

So, what is the significance of Pentecost? In short, it is a seminal moment in God's plan of salvation. For all who confess Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior, Pentecost and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit reminds and assures us that Jesus keeps his promises. Anyone who truly receives Jesus as Lord and Savior receives new life through the Holy Spirit. They are united with Jesus and given the deep assurance that they belong to God and that nothing can separate them from that love so long as they remain in Christ.

Pentecost also marks the birthday of the church. In the Old Testament, God's people consisted only of Israel. Pentecost healed the divisions and animosities created at the Tower of Babel (Genesis 11:1-9), where people were divided by language and race because of their prideful arrogance. At Pentecost, through the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, folks from every tongue, race, and nation are brought together in Jesus Christ. God has reconciled us to himself through his son Jesus, and through him we have been made one in the church.

Finally, Pentecost reminds us of the church's primary purpose of sharing the Gospel to the ends of the earth. Throughout the remaining chapters of the book of Acts, the Apostles and followers of Jesus model for us how to be the church for the world. Indeed, the open-ended conclusion to Acts clearly indicates the church's ongoing mission of proclaiming the gospel until Jesus comes again. When the church shares the love of Jesus in word and deed, it carries out God's purpose and plan of redemption and restoration for our fallen world.


