

A Word from our Pastor

The Bible describes Jesus's followers in a number of ways. We are called forgiven sinners, adopted sons and daughters, beloved members of the body of Christ, and many others. All of these are key aspects of who we are in Christ. One of the most important identities we have as Christians is being a "sent people." Just as Jesus was sent into the world to show God's love, so He now sends us to do the same. After Jesus's resurrection, his followers received the Holy Spirit to empower them for that mission. Today, your and I are called to share in that task by the words we use and our actions in the world as we invite people to place their faith in Jesus just as we have.

Too often, churches become wrapped up in their own concerns, spending so much time running programs and dealing with internal conflicts that they have little energy left to build relationships with people outside the church. It's not surprising that many churches are shrinking or that a lot of church "growth" is more a result of Christians transferring from one congregation to another than it is the product of growing the kingdom on earth. Jesus's teaching makes it clear, however, that his followers are partners in God's mission of saving people who are lost in sin. It's not enough to simply talk about sharing our faith—it's part of our identity in being the people God calls us to be to reach out to the world around us.

Another important identity we claim as the church, and one that goes hand in hand with being a sent people, is community. There are a lot of ways a church lives into that identity. When we play together, we are building community. When we eat together, we are building community. When we study God's Word or talk about current events and how to apply our faith to them, we are building community. When we pray together, we are building community.

The early church as depicted in Acts 2 is the ultimate example of what it means for the Body of Christ to be in community. Whatever the believers did, they did together, learning about who they were and who God is at the same time. It's important to be part of a community because it gives us the opportunity to learn and grow alongside others as part of something bigger than ourselves. It also provides a nurturing venue for helping to build others up as we ourselves are being built up in the faith.

One of the realities of being human is that we allow ourselves to fall into routines. Those routines are meant to make life easier, but they can also distract us from living into our true identities in Christ. We habitually prepare the same way every morning going through the same motions, day in and day out. When we get home in the evening, we eat dinner, watch the same tv shows, and go to bed "religiously" at the same time. We come to church and sit in the same pews to offer the same ole' same ole' in our worship together. There's nothing inherently wrong with those things, unless they blind us to living into God's will for us.

In Christ we are new creations and adopted sons and daughters of God through our faith. We have been set free from the law of sin and death and made one people united through Jesus's sacrifice on the cross. God chose "US", you and me, to make known the riches of the glory we have through the blood of Christ shed for our hope and salvation. "Though we are many, we are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another." (Romans 12:5)

Our society needs a church that is consistently manifesting these kinds of values and living into the destinies God wills for our lives. That's the very definition of holiness and the sole purpose for the Church's existence. The Body of Christ (the Church) is tasked with a mighty calling, and that calling makes a difference in the world. The Church is important and we as members of it are vital to its effectiveness in the world. It's time to start living like we believe that to be the case.
