

A Word from our Pastor

My Grandmother used to have a framed piece of a quilt her mother brought over with her on the ship as they immigrated from Sweden. Sharing the story behind it was a way of reminding the family of our roots. The act of telling and retelling that story had the power of shaping our family identity and weaving together memories and values that transcend the generations.

Family reunions and extended family gatherings provide opportunities for family members to connect with cousins, aunts, uncles, grandparents, and others that they may not have seen in a while. They are also occasions for telling those common stories of heritage we share and remembering that we are always connected by our family ties.

Like family stories, personal testimony plays a crucial role in the church family, especially in worship. They recount stories of God's grace, His provisions, and faithfulness that is steadfast and perfect. The church bears witness through these testimonies to God's ongoing work in our lives, shining a light on personal transformations that have taken place in the community, and reminding us that God is always at work in our lives.

Later this month we will begin a four-week sermon series I felt led to preach (*The Puzzle of Family*) where we will look at the intricacies of navigating family life. We will be weaving into that narrative the importance of the wider church family as a unit that carries its own importance to the life of believers. In the Old Testament, storytelling was central to nurturing the faith of God's people, often describing God in terms of His liberating actions within the community: "I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of Egypt, out of the land of slavery." (Exodus 2:2) The people would retell these stories during family time and especially at the Passover celebration each year to remember God's deliverance, repeating them as a way of shaping the Israelites as a people who represented the family of God.

As a believer in Christ, I am a child of God—and so is every other believer—so are you. This means all of us are spiritual brothers and sisters—no matter where we are throughout the world! And although we may be different from one another, sometimes in significant ways, we have a common heritage—we are rooted together in Christ and have the same heavenly Father and the same ultimate goal: to do the Father's will. As part of God's forever family, we share in the same eternal inheritance that Jesus has secured for us through His death and resurrection.

It's often said that biological family bonds are stronger than any other relationships. But Jesus said, "Whoever does the will of my Father in heaven is my brother and sister and mother." (Matthew 12:50) Which means that all who follow the Lord are part of his family and share in a relationship that lasts forever. In a culture as divided as ours, it's good to be reminded of the family connections we have in Christ. It's also good to remember that we are called to serve God together, for we will be living in eternity with these family members from all nations and all places!

What are the stories in your family or community that remind you of who you are? What stories of God's faithfulness need to be retold to help reinforce your identity as a person of faith in Christ?
