

A Word from our Pastor

A friend complimented me the other day for my courageous mention of Charlie Kirk during worship this past Sunday. My first reaction was to minimize the mention, and pooh-pooh any bravado heaped my direction. After pondering this for a bit, I came to two conclusions: First, I very much agree that being willing to stand up for and lift one of the most consequential Christian apologists in our time is not only courageous, but should be a proud staple of churches throughout the Body of Christ. Second, I have been less than adequate and short on courage in this respect up to now.

That said, let me speak a little more boldly to you today. I am greatly saddened by the loss of Charlie Kirk's voice of faith to the world. His ability to engage people from all walks of life, but particularly a younger generation who has been let down in so many ways by preceding generations, was truly remarkable. He spoke boldly and eloquently about both his faith and his politics, drawing clear distinctions between the two while at the same time acknowledging their necessary interdependence. He rightly made it crystal clear that it does not matter if you are Christian or Atheist, Jew or Muslim, Hindu or any other religious affiliation, your faith will inform your politics, period. To say otherwise is just ignorant, and to label doing so as somehow improperly mixing religion and politics is, simply put, demonization by folks who are unable to defend their ideas with reasoned dialog and honest discourse.


And as much as I admire and celebrate those things about Charlie Kirk, the one thing I appreciated more than anything else and have always believed is an absolute necessity for a healthy and thriving social order was his penchant for open discourse with literally anyone and everyone! Even (actually especially) those who disagreed with him. It didn't hurt that he was brilliant and articulate and able to respond to almost every situation and challenge with facts and knowledge most of us normal folks would struggle to match. But at the end of the day, it wasn't Charlie's brilliance that made him such a capable debater. It was his faith. As he would often say, "My faith informs my political positions, but each of them stands on their own merits." He knew what he believed both spiritually and politically, and he knew that while matters of faith and politics necessarily intersect at many points, they are separate from one another much the way the kingdom on earth, while intimately connected to the heavenly realm, is not the kingdom of heaven.

As Christians, we need more of what Charlie Kirk represents for the world. We need to have faith that isn't bothered by challenges from people who don't know us or understand our convictions. We need a Church that is strengthened and fortified by deep and intimate knowledge of the Word. We need people who are willing to boldly stand up for the Good News and proclaim Christ crucified to the nations. We desperately need all true brothers and sisters in Christ to embrace their faith in ways that let a world in great need see Jesus Christ through the way we live our lives. And most of all we need to get the word out that the most important thing to all of creation is that Jesus Christ came into the world to save sinners.


I have said for years there are rumblings of a great awakening all throughout the Body of Christ. More people are saying it today than were before September 10th, 2025. I don't know if that is wishful thinking or prophetic utterance, but martyrdom can have a profound effect on people, especially among a youthful and exuberant following like that which makes up much of Kirk's audience. Regardless, it is an exciting prospect and once-in-a-lifetime opportunity for we Christians to experience something unique and immeasurably impactful to the Body of Christ and humanity in general. Charlie's death asks a question of all people today: Is the most important thing in your life Jesus? And if so, are you sharing that awesome news with the world? The way you answer those questions could have inestimable impact on the world.
